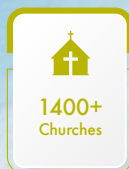
Mission

Founded by Hong Kong Chinese Christian Churches Union, Hong Kong Christian Council, Hong Kong Church Renewal Movement, frontline Christian agencies and churches which care for the poor, "Hong Kong Church Network for the Poor" (HKCNP) is a well-established network and community network platform which cares for the poor, delivers services and transforms the community collaboratively with partners. We are committed to identifying service gaps and developing multiple pilot schemes in response to the needs with our partner churches. With an emphasis on capacity building, empowerment and mentorship, HKCNP provides reliable services which combine knowledge and caring. We help and empower our frontline partners to expand services and be in contact with more deprived groups by consolidating community network resources, so the churches can deliver poverty caring work and achieve God's kingdom mission in the community more effectively.

Words from the Chairman

Time flies, and it has already been a year since I have served as the Chairman of HKCNP. HKCNP is a small organization with fewer than ten coworkers. Yet, through their dedicated service, we have successfully connected numerous churches, organizations, and individuals who share a heart for the grassroots. Together, we have built a collaborative platform to manifest Christ's love, aiming to advance the Kingdom of God on earth through transforming communities. Due to our limited manpower, our team focused on maintaining our expanding network and deepening existing ministries during the first half of last year. However, two significant issues occurred in the second half of the year that had a profound impact on HKCNP.

The first issue was the resignation of General Secretary Dr. Susanna Ma.

Fourteen years ago, Dr. Ma returned to Hong Kong from the United States and dove straight into this small organization. At that time, HKCNP had very few human and financial resources. We relied heavily on the support of our three founding organizations and various parachurch organizations. Through initiatives like the "Mentorship Program" and "Love Food Bank", we served the grassroots; there was even a period when a coworker from Hong Kong Industrial Evangelistic Fellowship served as a part-time officer. Initially unfamiliar with Hong Kong's gospel and poverty alleviation landscape, Dr. Ma's immense passion drove her forward. Alongside Rev. Li Ping-kwong and Dr. Philemon Choi, she tirelessly visited church leaders and passionate community

members to seek resources and service opportunities. Under her leadership, HKCNP saw significant growth in both capacity and funding. More importantly, she led the team in developing the "caring for the poor, network partnership and community transformation" community transformation model and connected churches into a service network. Thank God that HKCNP has gradually gained support from churches and community members.

In the middle of the year, Dr. Ma raised her resignation. Though it is a loss, we respect her decision for health and family reasons. Fortunately, her commitment to "succession training" has ensured a smooth transition, and the Board has appointed two Board members to contact with and pastor our coworker team.

On behalf of the Board, I would like to express our heartfelt gratitude to Dr. Ma for her years of sacrifice and contribution.

The second issue is the Wang Fuk Court Fire.

Although HKCNP is not primarily a disaster relief agency, the coworker team felt we could not stand idly by. The day after the fire, the team sought a HK\$1 million allocation from the Board to aid victims and coordinate with churches in Tai Po. For a small organization, this was a significant sum. Yet, Jehovah Jireh! While the Board was deliberating, our founding organization, Hong Kong Chinese Christian Churches Union (HKCCCU), informed us a sum of HK\$400,000 will be granted to HKCNP for emergency relief. Subsequently, our partner Hung Fook Tong offered to place donation boxes in their stores. The Board then established the "Wang Fuk Crisis Support Fund" and called for donations. The funding was used as phase 1 emergency relief. While the donations will be dedicated to long-term mental and spiritual care, should these funds prove insufficient, HKCNP will cover the remaining balance from our reserves.

Due to the government's privacy policy, HKCNP and our partner churches had no direct channel to reach the affected residents. Fortunately, our collaborative partners, Hong Kong Industrial Evangelistic Fellowship and Baptist Charis Social Service, were able to reach the residents in daily services. At the same time, Christian Action has long-standing ministries for domestic helpers. This enabled HKCNP to provide emergency relief supplies through them, while simultaneously mobilizing local churches to walk alongside and care for these residents, and distribute

a relief fund of HK\$5,000 to affected church members in need through our collaborating churches in Tai Po.

Praise the Lord that despite our lack of experience in disaster relief, we completed the first stage of the mission. Moreover, the Lord continued to provide—together with the fundraising from member churches of the HKCCCU and donations from various sectors, we raised over HK\$2 million. Compared to the number of people affected and the total resources raised by society, what HKCNP could do was indeed modest. Yet, we believe that even as a small glimmer of light, it allows people to witness the love of Christ. Furthermore, this relief effort has broadened our coworkers' understanding of how to collaborate with churches and other organizations, and we firmly believe this will enhance the effectiveness of the upcoming second and third stages of our work.

Whether it was the departure of the General Secretary or the Wang Fuk Court fire, both issues taught us that the path God leads us on is often unexpected and may even exceed our own strength. However, if we follow His lead, His provision will far exceed our expectations. May these experiences embolden us to move forward and strive to work for the Lord!

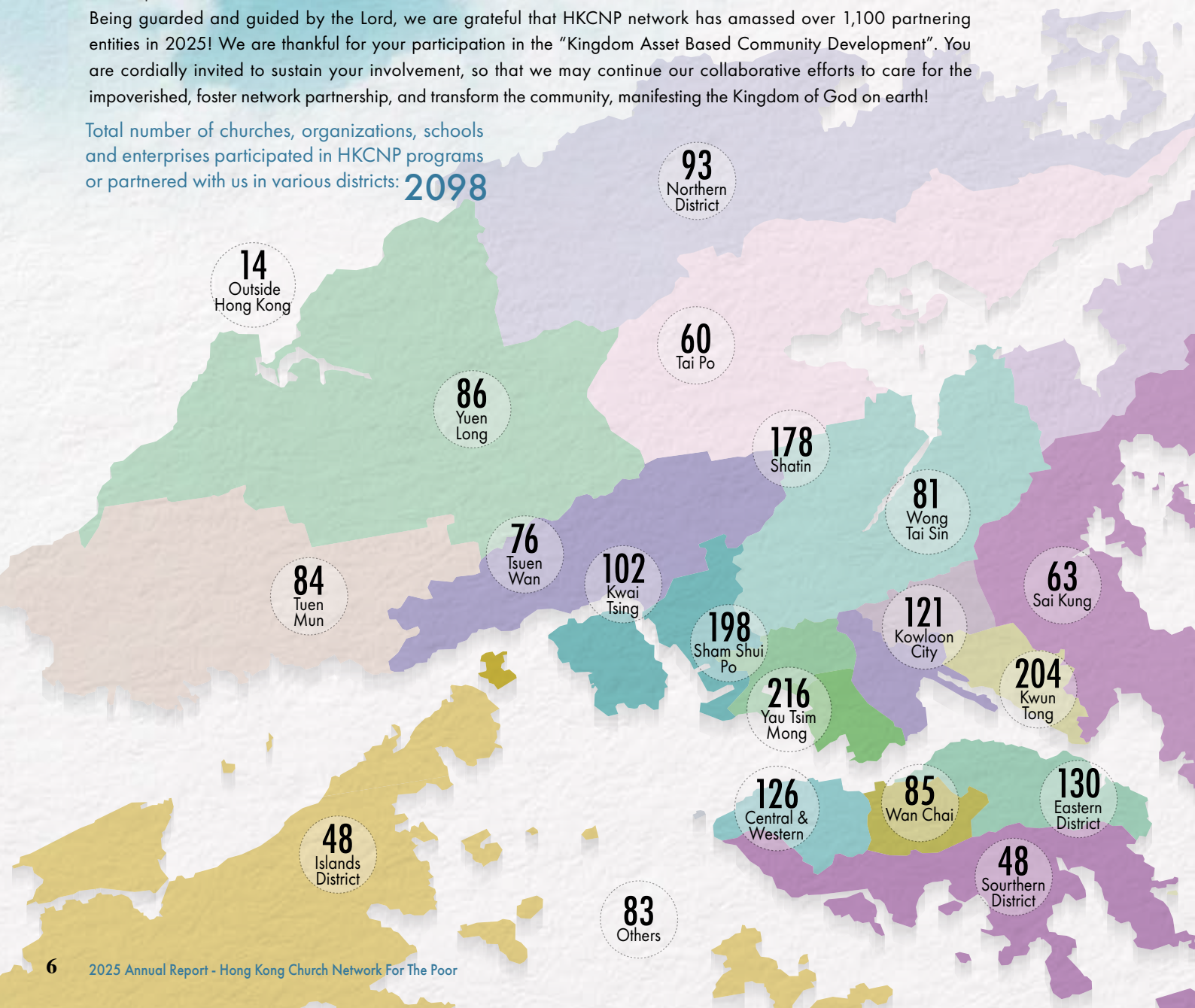

Community Transformation in Shui Chuen O

- 2014 HKCNP and our partner churches conducted prayer walks in the estate and gained a first-hand understanding of **the needs of the 30,000 residents who were about to move in**. While in the prayer walks HKCNP shared the vision of community transformation with partners.
- 2015-2017 **Established "HKCNP Shui Chuen O Network"**, having 4 core churches to serve the residents in one mind.
- 2019 Getting more understanding of the community needs by surveying to design service direction fitting to the needs of elderly singletons and doubletons living.
- 2020 Collaborating with Nethersole School of Nursing, CUHK to **launch "ABCD Shui Chuen O Family Network" project**. In the project, residents were trained and transformed to volunteers who were capable to serve their neighbors, facilitating mutual support culture in community.
- 2021-2022 The HKCNP Shui Chuen O Estate Network, in collaboration with CUHK, **established "Chuen Sum Cares for You" Visiting Volunteer Team**. Around 40 volunteers were trained to visit elderly residents living in the same building blocks, reducing the risk of home accidents involving elderly people living alone going unnoticed.
- During the pandemic, HKCNP established the "Anti-Epidemic Fund" to provide resources for churches within the Shui Chuen O Network in order to support the holistic needs of residents. Churches built trust and a close relationship with residents through the service programs such as: "Daily Necessities and Minor Home Repairs Support", "Volunteers Accompany You to Medical Appointments", "Volunteer-Assisted Home Cleaning Service Subsidy," and the distribution of emergency anti-epidemic supplies, testing kits, and PeaceBox. Through these tangible services, churches walked alongside residents during the pandemic, building trust and close relationships.
- 2023-2024 Four volunteers were invited to serve as **Community Ambassadors**, and **Leaders were appointed across the 18 blocks**, empowering them to lead the visitation and care for the residents. Meanwhile, **training for about 60 volunteers was successfully completed**, and the network has **expanded to include 15 major partner units**, collaborating with one heart to plan festive events and community services, **serving residents over 1,000 person-times**.

Community Transformation in Shui Chuen O

2025 Major Service and Impact

HKCNP Shui Chuen O Network has fully taken over the "Chuen Sum Cares for You" Visiting Volunteer Team and **renamed it the "Chuen Sum Cares for You Volunteer Team"**. They have also expanded the scope of services beyond festive visitations to include various Love in Action initiatives, such as leisure hubs, volunteer activities, tea gatherings, wellness exercises, and support for large-scale events. In 2025, the network **organized 75 activities, totaling over 7,000 person-times**. This not only fostered relationships among residents but also established a platform for volunteers to showcase their talents and build self-confidence, thereby **cultivating a sense of well-being and belonging within the community**.

The network has now **expanded to include 20 partner units**, and has successfully established team leaders for the "Chuen Sum Cares for You Volunteer Team" across all 18 blocks to care for their neighbors. Through volunteer training, residents are equipped to become helpers who conduct **regular visits to 143 elderly individuals living alone or as elderly couples**. Meanwhile, pastoring provided by pastors nurtures the spiritual lives of volunteers, enabling them to build up other lives with greater maturity, and establishing a supportive network of mutual care and assistance.

Directions for 2026

- **Leadership Training:**
To identify Christians within Shui Chuen O or residents from neighboring communities to take up leadership roles, with a strategic focus on discipleship training.
- **Strengthening the Mutual Care and Support Network:**
To provide targeted support responding to the needs of hidden elderly, caregivers, and youth; and to mobilize residents to utilize their talents in serving the community.
- **Four-District Management:**
First trying the "Greater Pastoral District" model, four core church pastors will focus on in-depth life nurturing and pastoring.

Community Transformation in Yau Tsim Mong

"Looking out from the church, I saw a homeless person walking by silently. Nobody noticed him, as if he was forgotten by the world... yet the church did nothing for him."

HKCNP's community transformation ministry in the Yau Tsim Mong district began with God enabling a pastor to see a homeless person whom nobody else noticed. Upon seeing this homeless individual, Pastor Allen Lai (Allen Sir) formed a "Mission Group" within his church at the time. Utilizing resources from HKCNP's "Love in Action," he joined with brothers and sisters to respond to the needs of the homeless, the grassroots elderly, and scavengers. During the pandemic, Allen Sir advocated for a "community-centered" service direction. As this aligned perfectly with HKCNP's mission of "Kingdom Asset Based Community Development" transformation model, he was invited to become the Convenor of the HKCNP Yau Tsim Mong Network and Consultant to the HKCNP Pastor Network. He established a community service network based on the "Kingdom Asset-Based Community Development (KABCD)" model. This included conducting community surveys to understand local needs and assets, launching the "Community Ambassador Caring Experience Program" to equip brothers and sisters, and building a peer network for pastors.

Currently, HKCNP Yau Tsim Mong District Network is piloting "Mutual Pastoring" within the district, encouraging churches to be community-centered and view the entire neighborhood as a single "pastoral setting", where pastors from different congregations respond according to the neighbors' needs and collaborate to better utilize resources, thereby increasing community assets. The network has established a robust resource network in the community, involving stakeholders such as professional fellowships, churches, restaurants, landlords, fruit market wholesalers, and hotels. Subsequently, a **"Core Group"** was formed to promote mutual support among ministers, while also paying close attention to the **"Yau Ma Tei and Mong Kok Urban Redevelopment"**, enabling churches to respond to community needs more flexibly and immediately, thus continuously transforming the community. For instance, during the Canton Road family tragedy in Yau Ma Tei in 2025, ministers responded instantly to become a safety net for the community, providing assistance to the affected families and neighbors, and turning the tragedy into an opportunity to catalyze and unite community strength.

Community Transformation in Yau Tsim Mong

2025 Major Service and Impact

- Feb to Nov Co-hosting "Holistic Healing – Joy, Peace and Health" talk to equip volunteers with holistic healing service
- May to Jul **Connecting 4 churches** (Christian Evangelical Centre Nianen Church, The Church of Christ in China Kei To Church, Canton Road Peace Evangelical Centre and Kowloon Pentecostal Church Jordan Chapel) to **launch the "HKCNP Interchurch Alpha Pilot Scheme for Underprivileged"**, mobilizing over 40 lay volunteers and enhancing their caregiving capacities; **approximately 50 grassroots individuals participated**, establishing deep pastoral relationships with ministers and volunteers to achieve common pasturing within the community.
- Aug 27 Following the Canton Road family tragedy in Yau Ma Tei, churches in the Yau Tsim Mong district convened to strategize, directly reaching out to the affected families and neighbors to provide counseling and immediate relief assistance.
- Dec 26 Joint-Church Christmas Event in the district, marking the **4th consecutive year of uniting churches, organizations, professionals, and workplace fellowships in collaboration to bless the grassroots.**

Community Transformation in Northern Metropolis

HKCNP's community transformation ministry in the Northern Metropolis began in 2021, following the government's proposal to develop a **300-square-kilometer** area accommodating a population of **2.5 million**. Through prayerful seeking, HKCNP discerned that this was not merely urban planning, but a strategic Gospel opportunity concerning future generations that would impact Hong Kong for the next thirty years or more. Consequently, since 2021, HKCNP has launched the "Kingdom Asset-Based Community Development (KABCD) Course" in the North District, centered on the theme "Entering Communities, Transforming Lives, Renewing Congregations." Rev. Barnabas Lee Hoi Ping, then-Chairman of the Christian North District Chinese Association (CNDCA), was invited to serve as the Convenor of the HKCNP North District Network, working in close partnership with the Association. Together, we trained 133 Christians from 18 churches, networking congregations in the North District to collectively respond to the needs of the emerging community. These included the livelihood deprivations of residents in public housing estates, self-owned properties, and squatter huts, as well as hidden needs underserved by the existing welfare system. It also explored how to release golden-aged believers as human resources to respond to the needs of the grassroots in the community. Progressing into 2024, HKCNP has continued to promote joint-church collaboration with **over 60 congregations in the North District, responding to community needs through network synergy.**

2025 Major Service and Impact

Jan to Jun	Utilizing the district evangelism subsidy from The Hong Kong Chinese Christian Churches Union (HKCCCU), 4 churches in the North District were connected to organize Praise Dance sessions, reaching out to 147 new residents in Tin Ping Estate. Among them, 8 individuals accepted Christ, 23 expressed willingness to receive home visitations, and 12 were transformed into active volunteers.
Mar	Launching the research report by The Hong Kong Polytechnic University on the " Healthy Ageing Leader Volunteer Training Program " conducted in Tin Ping Estate; empowerment and Co-creation: Partnering with Tin Ping Estate to establish a volunteer-led healthy ageing initiative.
Jun	Establishing the " HKCNP North District Learning Support Group ", collaborating with 6 churches (Sheung Shui Baptist Church, Christian Glorify Grace Church, Christian Canaan Church Hong Kong, The Church of Christ in China Sheung Shui Church, and Assembly of God Choi Po Gospel Church), along with multiple education professionals, the network responds to the needs of grassroots and cross-

boundary students in the North District. The **"Voice of the Northern Metropolis" Vision Trip for Marketplace** was attended by 50 business professionals and Christian fellowship leaders. Northern Metropolis School Collaboration Sharing Session was attended by **over 20 units and 50 individuals**. The two led to the immediate **establishment of the "HKCNP North District Learning Support Group"—linking 5 churches and multiple education professionals** to specialize in serving local grassroots and cross-boundary students.

- Nov At **"North District Thanksgiving Luncheon and Fellowship"**, over 40 cross-platform representatives from the Social Welfare Department of the Government, North District pastors, NGOs, volunteer groups, and the business sector gathered together to share ministry milestones and foster opportunities for future collaboration.
- Dec Through the **Christmas Caroling Ministry of HKCCCU**, across Tin Ping Estate in Sheung Shui, Pak Fuk Tin Sum Playground in Fanling, and Queen's Hill Estate, **over 20 churches were mobilized** and connected to jointly organize festive Christmas activities, successfully **reaching out to more than 4,000 residents**.

Directions for 2026

Strengthening joint-church collaboration and regional network through cross-sector collaborative ministries among churches and core groups and regular fellowships and retreats; Continuously nurturing District Coordinators and District Ambassadors to establish stable regional coordination mechanisms; expanding business sector engagement to integrate expertise and resources, thereby developing diverse models of community service.

Proactively Respond to new housing estate developments and encourage churches and partners to join Prayer Walks prior to residents moving in, and support churches to enter new communities during the intake period, establishing contact points and long-term ministries; key focus areas include Choi Shek Estate, Fung Wong Leng, and Kwu Tung area; driving churches to take root early, walk alongside residents, and foster long-term community transformation, thereby responding to the immense Gospel opportunities in the Northern Metropolis.

Community Restoration and Transformation in Tai Po

Since late November, HKCNP has been providing support to those affected by the "Wang Fuk Court Fire". Leveraging its role as a network platform, HKCNP invited churches, organizations, believers, corporations, and schools to collectively respond to the needs, mobilizing resources from all sectors to formulate more precise emergency relief measures and long-term community recovery and transformation plans, thereby witnessing Christ's power to transform communities in the midst of suffering.

Supports in November and December, 2025

- On the night of the fire, provided on-site support to address the immediate needs of evacuated residents from Wang Fuk Court and Kwong Fuk Estate; and continuously connected various sectors of society over the following two weeks to **deliver relief supplies to residents in need**.
- Called **57 churches** in Tai Po to assess front-line needs.
- Convened Tai Po Pastors for Crisis Meeting.
- Conducted phone consultations and physical visits to **12 churches** to care for the situations of both the congregations and local residents.
- Successfully invited pastors from **17 Tai Po churches** to establish a collaborative relief network.
- Produced an elderly-friendly resource integration leaflet for Tai Po churches.
- Formulated a community resource integration database.
- Established a volunteer database.
- Set up the "Wang Fuk Crisis Support Fund".
- Responded to requests from Yuen Long churches regarding food assistance for transitional housing ministries.
- **Co-organized the "Tai Po Wang Fuk Court Fire Victims Memorial Service" in Tuen Mun District**, praying for participants and inviting Tuen Mun partner churches to attend.
- Coordinated with Tai Po churches to conduct "Prayer Walks" across the Tai Po district.

HKCNP will mobilize partner churches to implement a range of support initiatives to address residents' immediate needs while walking alongside them in care. Meanwhile, through the "Wang Fuk Court Crisis Support Fund", churches are encouraged to design contextually appropriate activities, mobilizing the entire community to collectively become companions to the affected residents, thereby weaving a community culture of mutual support and care.

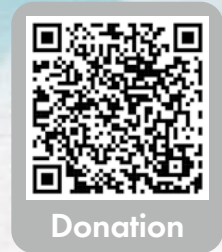
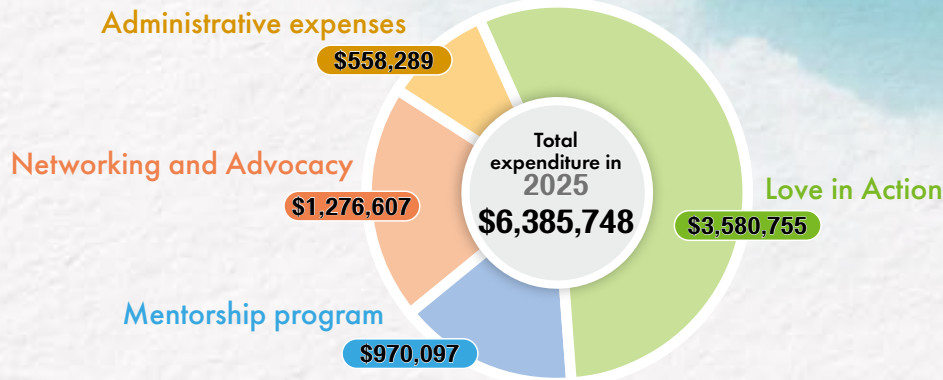

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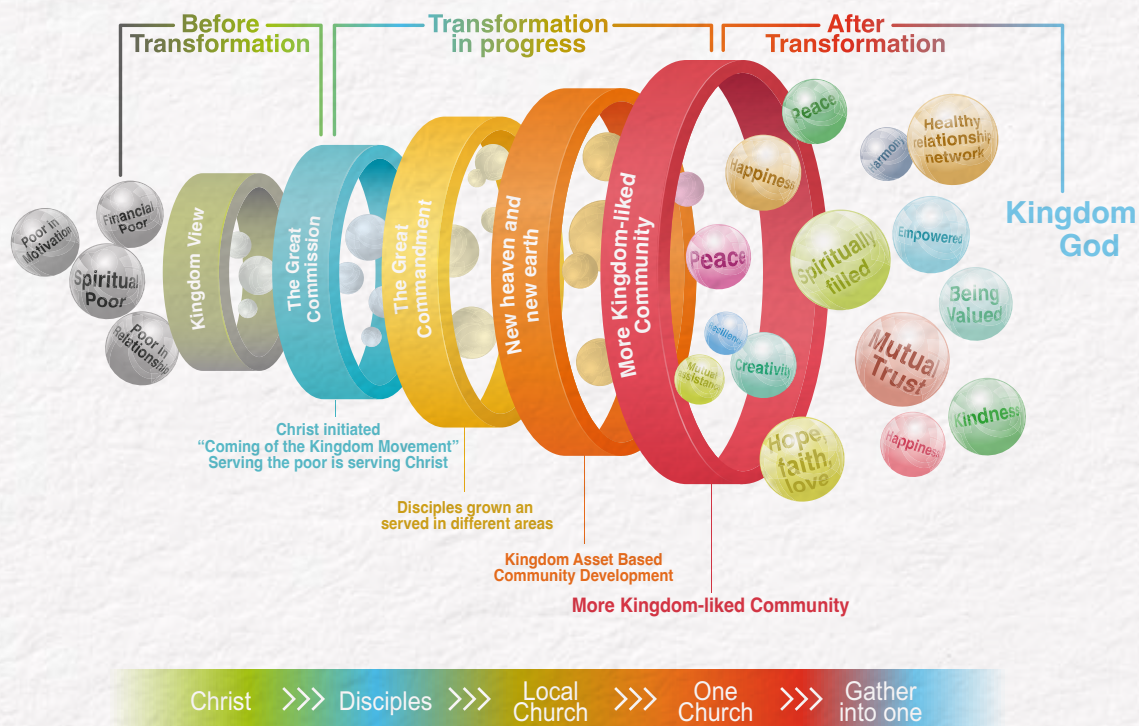
